Fortunately Bill was on top of the situation, managed the medevac to Lewiston, ID, then went back and disassembled the station. Vic reports that he is back up to 99% as of a couple days before press time.

# Idaho ARRL Convention Report

The Idaho ARRL Convention took place in Boise, over the weekend of 04/21-22, and the theme this year was "Ready for Anything". General Bill Shawver (director of Idaho BHS) was the keynote speaker in the general meeting, and he says that BHS is keenly aware of the emergency communication resource that Amateur Radio provides. In addition to the usual emergency preparedness discussions and displays, the point was also made that "anything" could include a shortage of hams, which leads to the idea that it's OK to enjoy ourselves in the hobby (which would look "cool" to prospective hams, hopefully drawing them in).
