The New Idaho Distracted Driving Law

Idaho Code 49-1401A goes into effect effective 07/01/20. As with most legislation, there are a lot of real fuzzy pieces in there. In general, the law talks about hand-held devices, but exempts Amateur Radio (and Citizens Band!) users. The other interesting aspect is that the law nullifies all County and City ordinances that involve distracted driving (actually a blessing, as we had a patchwork across the state). Short story, it's best to just stay off your cell phone or radio when driving in Idaho (or any state, for that matter)...

The Radio Amateur's Code

Probably all hams have seen this little write-up at least once. Always good to view again...

The Radio Amateur Is -

Considerate – He/She never knowingly operates in such a way that reduces the pleasure of others.

Loyal – He/She offers loyalty, encouragement and support to other amateurs, local Clubs, the IARU Radio Society in his/her country, through which Amateur Radio in his/her country is represented nationally and internationally.

Progressive – He/She keeps his/her station up to date. It is well built and efficient. His/Her operating practice is above reproach.

Friendly – He/She operates slowly and patiently when requested; offers friendly advice and counsel to beginners; kind assistance, cooperation and consideration for the interests of others. These are the marks of the amateur spirit.

Balanced – Radio is a hobby, never interfering with duties owed to family, job, school or community.

Patriotic – His/Her station and skills are always ready for service to country and community. Adapted from the original Amateur's Code, written by Paul Segal (W9EEA) in 1928.


