About a Whole Bunch of Stuff

To summarize some of the hot items:

- 1. ARRL encourages all Amateur Radio operators to join in the strong opposition to the FCC plan to increase the license renewal fee to \$50
- 2. The ARRL has established a "Learning Network" and they present weekly webinars
- 3. If you're a frequency perfectionist, the ARRL Frequency Measuring Test (FMT) will take place on November 13
- 4. Ham operators in Western Pennsylvania will operate four special event stations in celebration of the first voice broadcast by commercial station KDKA (Pittsburgh). (KDKA broadcast the results of the Harding/Cox Presidential election on 11/02/1920).

KDKA actually began operation in 1916, as Amateur Radio station 8XK. At the time there were no rules that prohibited Amateur Radio stations from "radio broadcasting". The station broadcast at a power level of 75 watts and was operated by Dr. Frank Conrad (8XK) who was assistant chief electrical engineer at Westinghouse Electric and Manufacturing. Dr. Conrad was later assigned Amateur Radio call signs 8ZZ, then W8XK.

The four special event stations will operate as K3K, K3D, K3A, and W8XK. (Four area Ham Clubs will operate the special event stations). View W8XK on QRZ for a lot more information.

About "Standard Time"

The phrase in the fall is "Fall Back" (one hour). Aside from the sun going down in the middle of the afternoon, we have to make some mental adjustments regarding our net schedules because there is no such thing as Zulu Daylight Saving Time.
